From the Rector

Dear Friends,

At the end of next week, the official beginning of the summer season arrives, and ... it seems as though it has already been here for a while. And it is, in fact, a surprisingly short season, because in only two months the light will have begun to change, the shadows lengthen, and the arrival of autumn will be obvious.

In the meantime, however, there is the glorious business of the busy-ness of the summer. There are the six garden patches that we again have in the Kent Community Gardens at Kent Center School

--they grow tomatoes, cucumbers, radishes, eggplants, etc., for distribution through the Kent Food Bank-- and they need loving care. The plots need volunteers to water, to weed, and to harvest in them, and Jake Fricker (860-364-9890) will be glad to know of your willingness to assist! Through the Food Bank we deeply touch the needs of our very near neighbors.

And there is the Tag Sale: the proceeds from it benefit the Capital Fund of the parish, and although there are no major projects in the offing, the fact that our three buildings (from 1826, from 1888, and from 1961) are aging suggests that there will be projects soon to come, perhaps even urgent ones. For we do live in New England, which is simply layers upon layers of various antiquities!

Through your various willingness to help with the Tag Sale -picking up donations, cleaning and pricing them, helping with
the displays, and then also selling the inventory on the 2 - 4
August means a great deal, make a difference.

There is also our ministry to the poor and the homeless near or on the streets of Torrington: they are our neighbors, if at somewhat greater distance than others. We take responsibility for serving the midday meal at Trinity Church in Torrington on the fifth Sundays of the months that have such, and 30 June and 29 September are 'Fifth Sundays'. Jane Hanley (860.927.3117) would love to learn of your willingness to serve Sunday dinner and to visit with the 40 - 60 people who rely on the soup kitchen for their daily bread.

Summer is a time for a 'different from usual' pace, and summer is upon us. It is a time to do things that in other parts of the year we cannot; it is also a time to remember that some important needs are not seasonal


