

Save the Date: Parish Annual Meeting, 05 February



On 05 February 2023, we hold our annual meeting. Please plan to attend. Canon Tim Hodapp and Amber Page Gehr of the Connecticut diocese will be with us, to start us on the path of calling a new rector. (We will *not* be searching for a priest-in-charge whose term as such would be limited to three years). The preliminary schedule on this Sunday following Douglas' final Sunday with us follows:

- 1. *There will be one service at 10:00 am*, at which Canon Hodapp will preside and preach.
- 2. Immediately following the service, Tim and Amber will address the parish about the rector search, the steps we will need to take and the support we will get from the diocese.
- 3. Immediately following that, we will hold our annual meeting, at which time we will elect a new class for the vestry, among other business.

Please make every effort to attend the 10:00 am service on February 5^{th} and what follows. Most of us have a lot to learn about the process of calling a rector. In the meantime, your wardens and vestry will do their best to keep everyone informed.


