Annual Pledging

I am writing to clarify how annual pledging and other monetary gifts get tracked at St Andrew's.

As you know, these generous gifts to our parish are necessary to keep our buildings and grounds well maintained, heated and cooled, pay for necessary employees and the many other expenses required to take care of our spiritual home.

I recently sent out a letter to all parishioners who made a pledge to the church in the fall of 2021 during stewardship season.

A number of people were surprised that some funds that they had generously donated were not captured by our pledge system.

I will try to address the key issues brought to my attention over the past few weeks.

Cash: Our weekly money counters cannot assign a name to any cash donation made unless it is in an envelope with a name on it or has some paper clipped note with a name on it. People who wish to donate cash without a name

attached should ensure that they keep their own records of these contributions, for tax purposes.

Pledges: We strongly encourage people to use pledge envelopes to prevent mistakes made in assigning names to pledges.

If someone does not wish to use envelopes and sends in a check, the check should clearly be labeled "pledge."

Some people do not make a formal pledge during stewardship season, but still send in money as non-pledge contributions. While we cannot account for these monies as pledges, we can and do account for these contributions as "non pledge income" in our operating fund.

Account specific donations: If one intends to send a contribution directly to a specific fund (such as the capital fund, the music fund, the flower fund, etc.), these contributions should be clearly labeled as follows: "pledge-XYZ fund."

Having said that, general giving—contributions not designated for any specific fund or purpose—pays for the vast majority of St Andrew's expenses. We encourage parishioners to give in this way, if they are comfortable doing so.

Given that this was my first time doing this exercise, I was pleased with the overall result and am grateful for some of your notes and feedback regarding what counts as pledges and what does not count as a pledge, but another type of donation. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to be in touch with me.



An Advent Practice to Try On: The Reverse Advent Calendar



We're all probably familiar with the traditional Advent calendar: Each day, you open a little window to read a verse or a thought ... or maybe get a small toy or piece of candy. Well, this year for Advent (which begins this Sunday), we're suggesting something a little different: a *reverse* Advent calendar.

Here's how it works: First, obtain a copy of the calendar (they're in the Narthex of the church and the Parish Office, and also available on the parish web site and Facebook page) and purchase the items listed. Also, create a space in your home—a box, a bag or a table—to be your 'calendar.' (The photo above is the first calendar we made in the Rectory a few years ago, on Day 3.) Then, each day in Advent, place one item in your calendar, perhaps saying a little prayer of thanksgiving or "O come, O come, Emmanuel" as you do. Finally, after Christmas, gather up all the items in your calendar and either bring them to the church or take them directly to the Food Bank on a Friday morning.

Among the many rich strands of Advent is the call to tune our hearts to Jesus in *expectancy:* in eager, loving anticipation of His Coming and His Coming Again. Spending four weeks joyfully and quietly preparing a gift that will help sustain a family during the cold, dark weeks of winter is surely a beautiful way to open our hearts to the Christ Child and His Peace.




