



#### St Andrew's Current COVID Closure Status

Parish Closed. Either the Town of Kent and/or a majority of the surrounding towns is in red status on the Connecticut COVID Data Tracker. Therefore all worship services will be pre-recorded and made available on our YouTube account at least an hour before they were scheduled to occur. In addition, all other parish activities will either be suspended or move to online-only; participants in those activities will be updated separately. The parish will remain in closed status until both Kent and a majority of the surrounding towns are less-than-red for two successive Thursdays.

## From Father Douglas

Dear People of St Andrew's Parish,

We are about to enter into a blessèd and blessing time of the liturgical year: several weeks in late December and early January that are rich in meaning, depth and variety in the opportunities for worship they afford us. While these weeks will be different this year—just like everything *else!*—nevertheless, I encourage you to consider the offerings that will be available between Christmas and the Epiphany and choose a few to attend. Even if we will need to record them and post them online (which appears likely, at this point), our very coming together ... from different places and at different times ... to worship Our Savior knits us together, in spiritual communion, as the Body of Christ that is the Church. Please add your own strand to our parish tapestry!

In addition to our Christmas Eve Eucharist (at 9:00 pm) and our Christmas Day Eucharist (at 10:00 am) and both Sundays within the twelve-day season of Christmas, we will observe the following holy days:

- Saturday, 26 December, The Feast of St Stephen: Stephen, the first 'deacon'
  of the Church (before it even had deacons!), was also its very first
  martyr. There is a certain poignancy in his feast day's so closely following the
  Feast of the Nativity: such is the both-and nature of our faith.
- Monday, 28 December, The Feast of St John the Apostle and the Evangelist:
   A day to celebrate both the writing (John is traditionally regarded as the author of the Fourth Gospel) and the ministry of this saint who was, perhaps, also the Beloved Disciple of Jesus.
- Tuesday, 29 December, The Feast of the Holy Innocents: Even more than our commemoration of St Stephen on the 26th, the Feast of the Holy Innocents bids us remember the costliness of our salvation. On this day we remember the innocent children living in and around Bethlehem whom King Herod had killed in an effort to prevent Jesus' earthly ministry from ever beginning.
- Thursday, 31 December, Service for the Eve of the New Year: We will mark
  the turn of the year with a series of readings and prayers and will conclude
  with an act of self-dedication for the new year at our threshold.
- Friday, 01 January, The Feast of the Holy Name: It is somehow fitting that on
  the first day of the new secular year, we celebrate the infant Jesus' naming
  and circumcision—by tradition, a practice delayed until the eighth day of life,
  when that baby's survival is more assured. Jesus became, in effect, even
  more 'with us' on the day of the year when we begin afresh and recommit
  ourselves to meaningful living.
- Wednesday, 06 January, The Feast of the Epiphany: On this day we mark the
  initial revelation of Jesus as the Word of God, Incarnate. We in the Western
  Church experience through the lens of the arrival of the three magi, who
  representing the entire Gentile world, while our Eastern brothers and sisters
  emphasize His Baptism. Either way, this day we pass from Our Savior's entry
  into this world to His divine mission in it.

Our celebrations of Christmas this year may be different: a little attenuated, a little less festive, a little weary or worn-out. That simply authentically reflects where we are in this world, right now. I invite you to consider adding some spiritual energy ... some additional reflection ... some even greater communion ... to your holidays this season by attending some of these special liturgies. They may draw you even further into the fullness of the Incarnation ... of Emmanuel (God with Us) ... in a year when we are so in need of it.

Sunday Evening Worship During Advent - Will

#### Be Recorded and on YouTube

Hard to believe though it may be, Advent begins on Sunday, 29
November. During Advent this year we will offer an additional time of worship on Sunday evenings at 5:00: Evening Prayer (without preaching), followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. If you have not experienced it, Benediction is "a short service of hymns and prayers offered while the Sacrament [i.e., the already consecrated Host] is placed on the altar" (St Augustine's Prayer Book, 194). The heart of the service is partaking, in silence, in the "the unending blessing flowing from God through the grace of the sacraments." The service ends with the Sacrament being placed back in the tabernacle to the accompaniment of a psalm or hymn. (We will record these liturgies and post them to the parish's YouTube account.)

The venerable tradition of Benediction does not 'speak' to everyone, and if you'd prefer to attend only Evening Prayer, there will an opportunity to exit before Benediction begins. But during these times when we cannot receive communion sacramentally, perhaps you may wish to 'try on' another experience of sacramental grace during Advent... as we prepare for the inbreaking of Christ into this world.


## Baby Furniture Available


