Jesus Casts Out Demons from the Gerasene Man :: Proper 7, Year C

Dear People of St Andrew's,

I hope you are doing well and enjoying the these first budding weeks of summer. (I know the calendar says summer begins in a few days, but I always feel like the season *really* gets started on Independence Day.)

Last week, I had the pleasure of meeting with Kent's new Director of Social Services, Samantha Hasenflue. Samantha began working in Town Hall earlier this spring, and she comes to Kent having served in several nearby communities. While I know we will miss Leah Pullaro, I think we're fortunate to have someone like Samantha succeed her.

A few of the things Samantha and I talked about:

- We will participate in the back-to-school backpack drive again this year. (I know, it's too early to be talking about back-to-school already!) Samantha is gathering names of students who'd like backpacks and will give us a firm count in a few weeks. We'll then take the month of July to gather in all our goodies.
- The town Food Bank is looking for additional volunteers Help is needed on Thursday mornings, when orders arrive from distribution centers and need to be put away; and Friday mornings, when the food bank is open

for clients. There is definitely a many-hands-make-light-work ethos here, and you may start as an alternate if you're not ready to commit to a regular schedule. Also, the Food Bank could really use *donations of hygiene products and laundry detergent*.

• Samantha is in the process of hiring an assistant. Once she has, she will be able to turn her attention to the *Kent Senior Center, located at Templeton Farms*. Her dream is to have frequent programs there—book discussions, movie viewings, crafts, etc. I didn't think it was going too far out on a limb to tell her St Andrew's probably has some folks who'd be happy to help with some of these events. In addition, she will be restarting the weekly lunch program at the Senior Center, and we'll be on the schedule to provide some meals.

Finally, Samantha shared with me that the number-one issue folks have been coming to her with since she arrived is housing. In this overheated real estate market, many landlords are choosing to sell the properties they've been renting, and, Samantha reports, there is often nowhere else in or around Kent for these low-income residents to live. (Some choose to live in their cars for a while. Some move to distant shelters or move away to live with relatives.) I invite your prayers for our neighbors who are losing homes they can afford to live in. In a few weeks, we will hear Jesus say, in the Gospel according to Luke, "'Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head.'" His broader point is the level commitment it takes to follow Him ... but clearly, what is good for foxes and birds is good for people, too.

Take good care, and may God continue to bless the work of the Kingdom you are doing.

This Monday: A Prayer for Juneteenth



Last year, Congress made Juneteenth, the day of June 19th, a federal holiday. A celebration of the final abolition of chattel slavery in the United States, Juneteenth commemorates the day in 1865 when the Emancipation Proclamation was officially announced in Galveston, Texas, following the end of the Civil War. Texas was the last state in the Confederacy to sanction slavery. (Because June 19th falls on a Sunday this year, the holiday will be observed on Monday.)

The Right Reverend Deon Johnson, bishop of the Diocese of Missouri, has written this prayer for Juneteenth:

Almighty God, you rescued your people from slavery in Egypt, and throughout the ages you have never failed to hear the cries of the captives; We remember before you our sisters and brothers in Galveston, Texas, who received the glad tidings of their emancipation; Forgive us for the many grave sins that delayed that liberating word; Anoint us with your Spirit to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim the year of your favor; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.




