

The Pharisee and the Publican (Tax Collector) Luke 18:9-14:: Proper 25, Year C

We, as baptized Christians, have the power to sanctify any moment. *The Rev. Canon Tim Hodapp*.

I listened again to Canon Hodapp's homily from two weeks ago and was struck in particular by these words. They brought to mind blessed moments I have experienced due to the remarkable insight and empathy of many of you.

That same Sunday Canon Hodapp met with the vestry to discuss the mutual ministry review process that we must begin this January as part of Father Douglas and St. Andrew's journey together. We will also be electing a new class of vestry members (3 in total) at our 2023 annual meeting, and I hope that you will consider whether you yourself would serve or if there is some other parishioner who would serve St. Andrew's as a vestry member for the good of

our common life.

Speaking of our common life, there is a prayer from Compline that I think captures the spirit of our common life at St. Andrews. It contains the following phrase: "Watch over those, both night and day, who work while others sleep, and grant that we may never forget that our common life depends upon each other's toil."

Such toil includes the work of our properties commission to preserve and enhance our campus, the wise and compassionate care of all involved in ministering parish finances, the music commission in opening our doors, the altar guild in its preparing our beautiful church for worship, the Sunday service greeters and servers in enhancing our worship, the weekly efforts of our verger and sacristan, those often unheralded who do so much behind the scenes for our weekly coffee hours, annual tag sale and bazaar, monthly soup kitchen service and care for those in need. There is a lot to do to keep a parish thriving, and I am quite sure I have missed something, like our church school leadership and our community outreach for example! I urge you to get in touch with Father Douglas or me if you are eager to be more a part of the common life of the parish as we head towards Advent.

Finally, one more example of that common life sustaining toil will occur on **Saturday October 29th**, beginning at 9:30 am and concluding with a pizza lunch when Michael Ward leads us in our autumnal cleanup. Please join him!



All Souls' Day: Wednesday, 02 November



Each year, two days in the liturgical calendar are devoted to prayers for those who have died in the faith. Allhallowtide (or Allsaintstide) occurs on the first and second days of November (with, much more famously, All Hallows' (*that is,* Saints) Eve beginning after sunset on 31 October). On *All Saints' Day, of November*, we remember all of the apostles, prophets, martyrs and heroes of

the Church who have taught us so much, by word and example, through their living (and, sometimes, dying) among us. As a parish, we'll celebrate All Saints' twice this year: with a small, weekday Eucharist at 9:00 on the first, and also at both Eucharists on Sunday, 06 November.

On *All Souls' Day, o2 November*, we recall all of those who have passed on before us and now feast at the heavenly banquet Christ has prepared for all of us. Also known as the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed, this day, for us, no longer dwells in notions of purgatory or harbors any *if*s about salvation, for we know it is *assured* by our baptisms! But even so, there is something comforting, reassuring and even unifying in coming together each year to be in spiritual communion with our departed loved ones ... lift up their memories ... and pray for them just as we also pray for those whom we see in this life.

We will gather for our Remembrance of the Faithful Departed at 2:00 pm on Wednesday, 02 November. If you would like to submit the names of loved one who have died, we will include them on our Necrology, praying and tolling the church bell for each one by name. Please email the Parish Office or leave a voicemail, by Sunday, 30 October. A quiet reception in the Parish House will follow this liturgy.

I am attaching a couple of photos. I had a blast and hope the students had a little fun. We certainly appreciate their making the effort!!






Next Saturday, 29 October: Fall Clean-Up Day

Vases will be available in the Narthex: simply arrange one vase and make that visit. It can be Sunday

Taking flowers to shut-ins, those recovering from an illness or welcoming a new baby, someone mourning a loss or someone who could just use a lift used to be a regular part of how St Andrew's parishioners cared for each other. 
