

**Jesus Gives the Great Commission** 

### From Father Douglas

Dear People of St Andrew's Parish,

I hope you are doing well. This past Sunday's monthly Vestry meeting was an exciting moment in the life of our parish family, and I am eager to share the news with you.

As you may know, our Visioning Team (John Barton, Nick Downes, George-Ann Gowan, Alice Hicks, Sarah Marshall, Lynn Perry, George Potts, Barbara Psarakis, Marel Rogers, Eric Roper and Michael Ward) has been meeting every two weeks since March. We have explored the history of St Andrew's and the Town of Kent; trends in our membership, participation, pledging and finances over the last two decades; and what St Andrew's has meant, over the years, both to us individually and to the wider community.

We also became familiar with some important new thinking about the Church —all churches—in the 21st century: We no longer live in a "convergent" culture of joiners ... of people who trust in and seek out institutions ... who look for validation and personal growth in group settings. Rather, we live in a "divergent" culture of hyper-individualism ... of people who question, distrust and discount most organizations ... who highly value personal expression and personal relevance. In a nutshell, the 20th century model of church, which largely relied on people taking social cues that led them right through our doors, is dead. Instead, to do the mission of God today, we must seek people where they are in their lives and attract them to us, so we can then share the

Good News of Christ with them.

To this end, on Sunday, after a lot of dreaming and reflection, the Visioning Team presented to the Vestry ... and the Vestry *approved* ... four specific recommendations for how the St Andrew's family can bring our neighbors into our midst and engage them in ways that open their hearts to faith, worship and service:

- 1. Connecting People with Jesus: Christian Education. One of our foremost duties as Christians is to help make new Christians! Therefore, we will pursue the hiring of a part-time Christian educator to connect with local families with children and plan and coordinate Christian education and activities for children and youth. (This person may also spend time on adult formation, as well.) Randy DiPentima, Ron Marasco and Chris Rehkow will head up this work.
- 2. Connecting Us to People in Need: Community Mission. We ourselves are the best tool we have for serving the local community, and therefore, the Mission & Outreach Commission will expand its remit. Currently M&O primarily makes cash donations to non-profits who request our assistance. Now, in addition, M&O will be responsible for connecting with local individuals and charities who need people to help them—with hands, minds, specific skills, etc—with parishioners who will go out, in the parish's name, to provide that help. (We may even wear St Andrew's T-shirts!)
- 3. Connecting People with Us: Community Events. We would like to become a regular destination for people and families who are not inclined to attend worship or ask us for help, so they get to know us and become a part of our family. To this end, we will put on a series of community events in the parish house, probably on Sunday afternoons—maybe several times a year or even once-a-month. The content will vary: perhaps recreation, perhaps a speaker or a discussion, perhaps a movie ... with parallel activities for children, so parents are always free to participate. These events will include a snack or light supper and conclude with prayer. Nick Downes, Janet Rivkin and Eric Roper, with an assist from Katherine Almquist's Hospitality team, will lead this work.
  - 4. Connecting in Thanks: Community Appreciation Events. There are so many people who do so much for the Kent community. As a leading organization in Kent, we should be sure they are honored and thanked. Thus, we will hold two or three community appreciation events each year for our first responders, our schoolteachers, our town employees, etc. We will begin in a couple of weeks with our Veterans' Day Appreciation Luncheon. George-Ann Gowan and Marel Rogers will coordinate these efforts.

Through discernment, our visions have now yielded tangible, particular paths to action. We stand at the threshold of a new era of community, of education, of charity, of hospitality and of discipleship. And with God's help and not a little prayer, we will become a beacon of hope ... a place of respite ... a source of growth for many in and around Kent who may not even know they need us. And how this will make Jesus smile!

If you would like to learn more and/or become in one of these activities, please reach out to any of the folks listed above, or to me, and we will get you connected, too.

Take good care, and may God continue to bless the work of the Kingdom you are doing.




