St Andrew's Current COVID Status

THE PARISH IS OPEN. At its meeting on 16 May, the vestry decided, in accordance with the latest guidance from the CDC and at the recommendation of the priest-in-charge and the wardens, to more fully open the parish for worship, as follows:

- If you are fully vaccinated, you may attend worship without wearing a
 mask or maintaining social distancing, but you may do so if you choose to
- If you are not fully vaccinated, we request that you either wear a mask and maintain social distancing or attend our outdoor worship (Sundays at 12:30)
- Congregational singing has now resumed, at the 10:30 service only
- NOTE: Our 12:30 Eucharist has been discontinued

In addition, it is no longer necessary to sign-up in advance to attend worship, but we will record the names of those who attend, in case contact tracing becomes necessary.

We will continue to livestream our 10:30 liturgy on Sundays and our mid-week services, as there are parishioners who are choosing not to be in group settings at this time—a decision the parish fully honors and supports.

From Randy DiPentima, Junior Warden

As preparations for the tag sale bring more of us together, I am struck by how working communally raises spirits and makes us of aware of the needs of others. The pandemic deprived us of this opportunity for so long.

Thinking about that and other things brought me to consider a story from Luke that continues to speak to me each time I read it. At Luke 10:38-41, we meet Mary and Martha, sisters, whom Jesus and his followers visit on their way to Jerusalem and the cross. Martha goes about being the perfect host to her visitors while Mary sits and listens to Jesus. When Martha complains to Jesus that Mary ought to be helping her, our Lord essentially tells her that now is not the time for her to be busying herself with hospitality tasks and that Mary has in fact got it right: When Jesus comes to visit, it is time to sit and listen.

I know that sometimes I am like Martha for the wrong reason—busying myself to avoid sitting and listening to things difficult or tiresome to hear. Maybe that is part of what the story is about. Mostly though, as the Reverend Peter Gomes in his sermon "Sisters – Mary and Martha" tells us, it is about "life, about giving and receiving, about doing and being, about the presence of Jesus in the midst of the ordinary that becomes extraordinary." Which is to say, as myriad ordinary things begin again or anew at St Andrew's we, amidst the ordinary, may feel the extraordinary presence of Jesus.


