



### St Andrew's Current COVID Closure Status

Parish Closed. Either the Town of Kent and/or a majority of the surrounding towns is in red status on the Connecticut COVID Data Tracker. Therefore all worship services will be pre-recorded and made available on our YouTube account at least an hour before they were scheduled to occur. In addition, all other parish activities will either be suspended or move to online-only; participants in those activities will be updated separately. The parish will remain in closed status until both Kent and a majority of the surrounding towns are less-than-red for two successive Thursdays.

## From Father Douglas

Dear People of St Andrew's Parish,

I hope that you are having a blessed Christmastide. The season of Christmas really *is* 12 days long—that's not just a song about golden rings and pear trees!—and it is good for us to continue to reflect upon our dear Savior's appearance here on earth and all the grace, love and charity He always provides us, no matter what we circumstances we find ourselves in.

I'd like to share two brief thoughts with you this week.

First, we recorded a simple, spoken *liturgy for New Year's* Eve that is equally suitable for New Year's Day—or arguably, any of the first few days of the new year. While the secular celebration of a new year focuses on 'out with the old, in with the new' (and never is this more welcomed than this year!), our New Year's liturgy hearkens back a couple of centuries to covenanting services that John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist offshoot of Anglicanism, held—sometimes with hundreds or thousands of people at one time. The content of this service is three lessons that hold up for us, first, the fact that all time belongs to God, Who provides it to us as a gift; second, that the salvation Christ has procured for those who believe is forever; and third, that with our twin gifts of time and salvation, God desires us to serve and help, to love and show mercy. All of this points to the covenant with God in which we live, and the service fittingly concludes with an act of re-dedication, in which we give ourselves over, again, to God and ask God to use us however God sees fit.

This is a brief service—30 minutes; no sermon!—and, I think, a meaningful way to enter into a new year ... especially a year in which the challenges we faced in 2020 will still linger and in which we will, God willing, also begin to live into the new reality of post-pandemic life. You can access the service and the bulletin, with the readings and prayers, on the St Andrew's web page.

Second, Jim and I will be on vacation from Wednesday, 06 January, through Friday, 15 January. (We are fortunate to have the Rev Cam Hardy preaching and celebrating on the 10th.) This means that the parish voicemail and email will be checked only on Tuesday and Thursday, when Laura is in the office. 
#### Welcome our 'New' Parish Administrator!
