St Andrew's Current COVID Closure Status

Parish Closed. Either the Town of Kent and/or a majority of the surrounding towns is in red status on the Connecticut COVID Data Tracker. Therefore all worship services will be pre-recorded and made available on our YouTube account at least an hour before they were scheduled to occur. In addition, all other parish activities will either be suspended or move to online-only; participants in those activities will be updated separately. The parish will remain in closed status until both Kent and a majority of the surrounding towns are less-than-red for two successive Thursdays.

From Father Douglas



Dear People of St Andrew's Parish,

No, this photo from the rectory is not of some misguided attempt at an at-home version of "The Price Is Right!" Rather, it is the beginning stages of a great new Advent tradition that a parishioner brought to my attention this week: the *reverse* Advent calendar. You begin by purchasing 24 food items that are in high demand at local food pantries. (The list is available here.) Then, each day in Advent, you add one item to your calendar (I created ours on a hall table—next year, I'll choose a larger space!), and by Christmas Eve, you will have stored up a veritable feast. You then take all the food you've gathered to a local food pantry, as a donation.

I think this is a wonderful idea, for several reasons. For one thing, November and December are usually the months of highest demand at food pantries across the United States, and this year this increased seasonal demand will put further strain on our food pantries' resources that have already been drained by the pandemic. For another, the physical acts of shopping, placing and schlepping, as well as the unavoidable visual reminder of others' hunger, all serve to underscore Our Savior's teachings to take care of the neediest among us.

—to help feed the hungry reminds us of the message in the song Mary sang after the Angel Gabriel told her she would bear a Son: "He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty" (Luke 1:52-53). Mary's *Magnificat* underscores for us that Jesus came into the world not only to save sinners, but also to put right the ways of this world ... to supersede the sometimes stingy, always precarious peace-of-man with the full and lasting peace-of-God. Advent is an appropriate season for us to roll up our sleeves and participate in this right-ing, and what better way than by helping to feed the hungry who live right among us?

It's not too late to start your own reverse Advent calendar for this year. Or, if that idea doesn't appeal to you, to take up another Advent practice that aligns you, body and soul, with those who have the least and need the most. Whatever practice you choose to take up, you will be embodying the Christ Child Who, as we will soon celebrate, came bodily unto us. Thanks be to God.

Sunday Evening Worship During Advent – Will Be Recorded and on YouTube

Hard to believe though it may be, Advent begins on Sunday, 29
November. During Advent this year we will offer an additional time of worship on Sunday evenings at 5:00: Evening Prayer (without preaching), followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. If you have not experienced it, Benediction is "a short service of hymns and prayers offered while the Sacrament [i.e., the already consecrated Host] is placed on the altar" (St Augustine's Prayer Book, 194). The heart of the service is partaking, in silence, in the "the unending blessing flowing from God through the grace of the sacraments." The service ends with the Sacrament being placed back in the tabernacle to the accompaniment of a psalm or hymn. (We will record these liturgies and post them to the parish's YouTube account.)

The venerable tradition of Benediction does not 'speak' to everyone, and if you'd prefer to attend only Evening Prayer, there will an opportunity to exit before Benediction begins. But during these times when we cannot receive communion sacramentally, perhaps you may wish to 'try on' another experience of sacramental grace during Advent... as we prepare for the inbreaking of Christ into this world.

It is with deep regret that we announce that Heather Scofield has decided to leave her position as Parish Administrator, so that she can more fully pursue her artistic endeavors. Heather's last day with us will be Thursday, 03 December.

Computer Help is Available


